Easter Sunday at First Parish

Rev. Marta Morris Flanagan, Lead Minister, preaching Sunday April 20, 2025, at 10am at the Meetinghouse and on Zoom

On Easter Sunday Lead Minister Rev. Marta Flanagan will offer the sermon.

During worship children pre-K to grade 6 will enjoy easter egg hunts and then return to the sanctuary for a sharing of matzah and grape juice with the entire congregation.

As in the past, communion will be offered during our Easter service. First Parish has no creedal tests for involvement. Our communion is an open table. All are welcome. We each bring our own interpretations of the sharing of bread and wine. Our blessings will be translations of the Hebrew spoken every Friday Shabbat in Jewish homes. In keeping with Passover, the elements of our communion will be matzah and grape juice.

NOTE: The Town of Arlington has a Revolutionary War reenactment scheduled for Easter Sunday. Starting at 1pm on Sunday, Massachusetts Avenue and surrounding side streets will be closed to all traffic. Partial road closures could impact your ability to leave First Parish starting at 12:00pm - please plan

accordingly.


